President's Report

Hill climbing for 2020 is about to start, with our first event this coming Sunday, 2 February. Fortunately, the track and facilities are in good condition, having not been affected either by the bushfire which burned through Oaks Estate, Pialligo and

West Queanbeyan last week or the extraordinary hail storm which hit a few days earlier. Given what so many people

across Australia have experienced this summer, we have been very fortunate.

We have ten events programmed for the year: eight club hill climbs, the annual Heart Kids Hill Climb and a round of the NSW Hill Climb Championship. Three of the events (including Heart Kids) are two lappers, which are always exceptionally popular. The revised calendar is included in this *Over The Hill*. Please note that the dates for the Heart Kids event (now 5 April) and August club one lapper (now 9 August) have changed from the provisional calendar issued in November. Based on last year, I expect we will again have full fields and close racing, which will guarantee great events for both competitors and spectators.

SDMA's Round of the NSW Hill Climb Championship (NSW HCC) will be in October and it will be the last NSWHCC event for 2020. If the Championship is very close at that stage, it could mean that we will have some extremely serious and exciting competition on offer. SDMA club members will have the opportunity to enter so there so the chance to compete against quite different competition.

The success of all our events will depend on how well we manage ourselves as a club. We have a fantastic facility with an excellent track and first rate amenities. But to conduct events to the high standard we expect of ourselves and to continue to be able to provide really good community based motorsport, we need more people to share the load of running the club. If you've read this before, I apologise for having to re-state the obvious: events don't run themselves. We need to increase the number of people who are prepared to contribute to the club by helping out with the work which needs to be done.

This Saturday we will have the first working bee of the year to prepare the track for Sunday. Over the next few months there will be extra working bees, at weekends and during the week, to build the new infrastructure which we have to get in place. When the notifications for those working bees go up on our Facebook page, or arrive by email or text, please make a conscious effort to put some time aside to help out. It's your club and you will benefit from the improvements we make.

Urgently, the club has an immediate need for someone to take over as Membership Secretary, which is a critical position. No-one nominated for the position at the AGM in September so Henry and Liz Hilhorst, who had done the job for many years but are no longer available to do it full time, have continued to do it part-time since the AGM. But we now are at a crunch point as they will be away from this month and we need someone urgently. It's an important job which requires patience and attention to detail. You need to be able to operate a spreadsheet, be cheerful, patient and helpful to your fellow (and potential) club members when they need to renew their memberships and to liaise with the Event Secretary before each hill climb to make sure that people who have entered are financial club members. Can someone please put their hand up to either me or Dave Peisley, the Club Secretary? If anyone would like to talk to Henry about the work involved, he would be very happy to discuss.

I mentioned in the last edition of *Over The Hill* that our social media team has been doing a great job lifting our profile on Facebook with scheduling software installed and more people reached and new followers. Over the next few months the team will be putting more information up, focussing on providing easy to follow advice on how to get involved in our sport and publicising upcoming events. Celeste, Mark and Kimberley have done a great job in making more people aware of SDMA and what we do.

A related priority for 2020 is to upgrade our web page. In the next few weeks we will be asking members to tell us what they would like on a revamped site with the intention of doing a staged upgrade.

Have an enjoyable and successful hill climbing year.

CHANGE TO SDMA COMMITTEE MEETING DATE

The Club Committee has changed its meeting date.

From February, the committee will meet on the SECOND Tuesday of each month, still at the 7.30 pm at the Canberra Southern Cross Club in Woden. Previously it met on the first Tuesday of the month at the same time and venue.

Pitstop Cafe:

We don't sell 'virtual' sausage sandwiches, so please pay CASH!!

The Pit Stop café is the hub of the track. Since time immemorial (well since 2001 actually) everyone who's anyone has lined up to buy sausage sandwiches, egg and bacon rolls, coffee and life's other essentials (i.e. Freddo frogs).

And they've paid **CASH**. Yes, good old coins and notes. That cash has helped the club improve facilities and resurface the track, so it's been very worthwhile.

Because the Pit Stop is run by volunteers (*extremely* dedicated volunteers) and we only operate 9 or 10 times a year, the Pit Stop will continue to be **CASH ONLY**.

The cost of introducing PayWave and similar technology is not justified by the scale of our operation and the time involved in processing and reconciling bank transfers for two sausage sandwiches and two Cokes can't be justified either.

So can everyone please remember that the **Pit Stop is a CASH ONLY operation**, so bring coins and small notes with you (and no \$50 notes early in the morning please!!).

FRONTAL HEAD RESTRAINTS (FHRs), ALSO KNOWN AS HANS (Head and Neck Support) devices

From the beginning of 2020, **CAMS require drivers of cars that have a CAMS logbook to use a Frontal Head Restraint** (FHR) when competing in Speed Events (which includes hill climbs).

The new rules apply only to cars which have CAMS log books and then only to those cars which are equipped to accept them.

The new rule does not apply to road registered cars or to cars which do not have CAMS log books, meaning it doesn't affect most of the cars that compete in our events.

The rationale for the new rule is safety, given that FHRs are now used in most other forms of motorsport and that they provide a significant safety improvement.

The new rules are explained in detail on the CAMS website.



SUNDAY'S HILLCLIMB

The first event for the year is this Sunday, 2 February. We have a full field of entries and it looks like it will be a very competitive start to 2020.

A few reminders:

- Frontal Head Restraints (FHRs). If your car has a CAMS log book and you present the log book at scrutineering, you must have and use a CAMS compliant FHR, previously known as a HANS device. This rule came into effect on 1 January this year. There is no requirement to have or use a FHR if you are competing in a road registered car or an unregistered vehicle which does not have a CAMS log book. The CAMS rationale for the new rule is safety, given that FHRs are now required in most other forms of motorsport.
- **Fire safety**. When vehicles are being refuelled in the pits, please exercise extreme care. The whole pit area is a no smoking zone at all times and even without the tragic bushfire season which Australia has experienced, we all have to be very mindful of potential fire hazards.
- **Refreshments at the presentations**. The club will, as usual, provide light refreshments (beer, wine, cheese and bikkies) at the presentations after the competition runs. Everyone is very welcome to stay and relax with opponents and friends (sometimes they are one and the same) and to wind down after a serious day's fun.

Drones at SDMA events

Both the Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA) and CAMS have rules on the operation of drones which apply to SDMA.

- The CASA rules, which have the force of law under civil aviation legislation, apply because the track is within 3 nautical miles of Canberra Airport and is directly under the approach path of the East West (12/30) runway
- The CAMS rules apply because CAMS endorsement of SDMA events provides the legal, safety and insurance frameworks which allow us to conduct an event

CASA requires anyone proposing to operate a drone under the flight path to submit a six page Remotely Piloted Aircraft Flight Authorisation application well in advance of the planned operations. CASA will then assess the proposed operation. It also requires all the operators of the drone to be licenced and to pay fees to CASA.

CAMS requires that drones are only flown by an operator who

- is certified by CASA;
- carries their own public liability insurance; and
- provides the necessary information to SDMA to enable SDMA to meet all the relevant parts of CAMS safety rules

CAMS requires SDMA to closely manage any drone operations during the event, including the number of drones flying, how close they are flying to competitors, spectators, medical and recovery vehicles and personnel, and the need to keep them away from the track. This would require extra event officials to be dedicated solely to managing drone operations.

Given all these complexities, plus the very significant potential costs should there be an accident involving a drone being used during an event, the club has decided that drones will not be allowed at SDMA events.


