Chief Scrutineer's Report

Round Four – One Lap Hillclimb - Sunday 2 May 2021

A great day for hill climbing with top weather and a full field of entrants.

17 vehicles were inspected by the scrutineering team of Mark Wyatt and me. The checks are carried out as part of the club's *Managed Scrutineering* system introduced in March this year, which provides that first time entrants at Canberra HillClimb (both cars and drivers) are checked and around 10 per cent of other competitors' vehicles are also scrutineered.

These Chief Scrutineer's Reports in *Over The Hill* are to let members know how many cars were checked at each event, to highlight issues which scrutineers think drivers need to be reminded of and to draw attention to new, unusual or exceptionally well presented vehicles.

A focus for the scrutineers at this event was tyre pressures. In recent events two vehicles had tyres squeezed off their outer rims, fortunately without

serious damage or injury. The Fairbairn Park circuit generates high cornering forces, especially on the left front, so it's important to raise front pressures by about 4 psi or 27 kPa to compensate. An indicator of pressure being too low is entering a corner and the car ending up in a different position on the track compared to where you predicted/intended. It's also important to keep checking tyre pressures throughout the day, as track conditions can alter with weather changes.



My vehicle of choice for the day was easy: the debut of the custom made 'Land Rover Series 1' built and driven by Robert Gregg. It was formerly a Ford Model A bucket and ran in a lot of SDMA events in the last few years. Robert used the frame and V8 running gear, and then custom made all the paneling, finishing it off with a paint job in authentic Land Rover green. It attracted a lot of attention and really stood out. Well done, Robert.

COVID AND THE HILLCLIMB

As events in Victoria this week have shown, COVID-19 is still with us. To keep our hillclimbs COVID-free and to comply with ACT Government legal requirements please follow these simple measures:

- Before coming to an event, check the ACT Government COVID site https://www.covid19.act.gov.au/community/travel to make sure that you haven't been anywhere in the last 14 days that is a designated COVID -19 affected area.
- When entering the track, everyone must sign-in using the Check In CBR app/QR code.
 There are no exceptions: all drivers, pit crew, officials and spectators must be electronically signed in. So please make sure you have the Check In CBR app on your phone.

If for some rare reason you can't use *Check In CBR* (e.g. you don't have a smartphone), talk to an official (they're in fluoro vests) as soon as you arrive and they will help you.

By law, everyone on site must be electronically checked in.

At the track, follow COVID-19 protocols:

Maintain social distancing;

Use hand sanitiser:

If you want to wear a mask, feel free to do so.;

If you feel unwell with COVID-19 symptoms, immediately leave the hillclimb and get tested.

NEW EVENT ADMINISTRATION CENTRE... UPDATE!!

As you can see in the photos, the second 40 foot container for the Event Administration Centre was delivered last Wednesday (26 May). It fitted perfectly on the foundations prepared over preceding weeks by Geoff Bassingthwaighte, Col Merz, Peter McDonald, Henry Hilhorst, David Yates and John Templeton.

The new container is of the same high quality as the first, which we means we have a matching pair of top specification units in which to set up the functions we want to accommodate: an Event Secretary's office, a workshop, consolidated secure event equipment storage and an area for scrutineering equipment and records.

The next jobs are to

- Dismantle the old carport in the bottom corner of the pits so the trusses can be re-used for a roof across the full width of the scrutineering bay. This will also free up extra pit space.
- Install the new roof and guttering creating a wider scrutineering bay
- Fit out the interiors of the containers.

As outlined in last month's *Over The Hill*, there's a lot still to do before the centre is finished. This will involve jobs at both normal pre-event working bees and some specially called working bees, which will be notified by email and on the club Facebook page. So if you are able to help out at either type of working bee, please do so.

As well, getting the project finished will be greatly helped if we could have the long term loan of some key bits of equipment we're going to need. If you have any of the items below and can spare them for the next 12 months of so, the club will give them a (temporary) good home and store them very safely and securely.

EVENT REPORT: ROUND FOUR OF THE ACT HILLCLIMB CHAMPIONSHIP

SUNDAY 2 MAY 2021

Another good day of motorsport. A strong field (63 competitors), beautiful weather, five class records broken and significant achievements by two of our female members. Topped off by an embarrassing faux pas at the presentations by the President.

The field limit for a one lap event is normally 60 cars, but we were able to squeeze in three of the reserves this time to give us one of the biggest fields for quite a while. The vehicles covered 19 different classes, with 10 classes having three or more competitors so there was good competition throughout the day. Five runs were completed with the overwhelming majority of entrants (58) lining up for all five.

Class records were set by

- Mark Wyatt, in Type 4 1601-2000c, who cut the previous record of 46.95 seconds by 0.14 of second to establish a new mark of 46.81 seconds
- Bohun Martin, in Type 5 1301-2000cc, whose 44.68 seconds on the last run of the day eclipsed the previous record of 45.26 seconds
- Pedro Hietanen, in Type 6 1301-2000cc, who displaced the old record of 45.79 seconds with a time of 45.42 seconds in his third run of the day
- Iain Chandler, in Type AWD 1/2 2001-3000cc (also known affectionately as Type Yaris GR because all five entrants in the class were immaculate new white Yaris GRs), who took the previous record of 48.20 seconds (set by his father Colin at the April event) down to 46.69 seconds on Iain's second run.
 - This record has dropped from 50.58 seconds to 46.99 seconds in four events as Colin and Iain have battled it out.
- Zac Le Lievre, in Type AWD/SV4 up to 1600 cc, who cut the old record of 41.45 seconds by the smallest of margins 1/100th of a second with a new mark of 41.44 seconds on his second last run of the day.



Zac also took out Fastest Time of the Day with his 41.44 seconds and Toby Wilson was the Fastest Junior of the Day, with a time of 51.27 seconds in the RX 7 competing in Type 3 2002-3000cc.

Fastest female Driver was Melody Wyatt, who had an outstanding result to win her class (Type 3 1601-2000cc) against a field of six other (male) drivers. It was the first time a female driver has won a class which had more than one entrant so congratulations to Melody. Her progress since joining the club six years ago as a keen 15 year old has been wonderful to watch.

Another significant achievement was Celeste Oringo passing her assessment to be a Motorsport Australia accredited Event Secretary. Celeste has been helping Dave Peisley with the Event Secretary role for the last year and has done a great job, a judgement confirmed by her positive result for the MA licence. The club greatly appreciates the work done by all our officials, especially those in complex and time consuming jobs such as Event Secretary or Clerk of Course. So congratulations and many thanks to Celeste.





The presentations after the event were, as usual, very enjoyable but were marked by an unfortunate misunderstanding about birthdays and cupcakes. Celeste was celebrating her birthday and so was Haemesh Catterall, who had just won his class (Type 3 up to 1600cc) in his Honda Civic. Haemesh's wife Candice very generously brought cupcakes along for everyone to celebrate both birthdays, but John didn't realise it was a double celebration and only marked Celeste's happy day. Everyone was cheerfully eating the cupcakes intended for both Haemesh and Celeste, without Haemesh even getting a mention! Sincere apologies and delayed birthday congratulations to Haemesh and thanks to Candice for her generosity. We'll try (belatedly) to rectify the mistake at the 6 June event.

SCRUTINEERING

In conjunction with Motorsport Australia's COVID based approach to online event entry, SDMA has introduced 'managed scrutineering' under which at least 10 per cent of competition vehicles will be physically checked at each event.

Key features

- 1. Online entry will continue to be the only way to enter an event. Completing both Motorsport Australia self-scrutineering declarations will still be mandatory.
- 2. Competitors must still provide the SDMA Statement of Vehicle Compliance when arriving at an event.
- 3. Any vehicle entered for the first time will be scrutineered in the Scrutineering Bay before the event.

 This applies even if the driver has competed previously.
- 4. Any driver competing for the first time must take their vehicle to the Scrutineering Bay to be scrutineered before the event.

This applies even if the vehicle has competed previously.

5. In addition to vehicles selected under (3) and (4), another four to six cars (10 per cent of total entries) will be chosen by the Chief Scrutineer after entries close to be inspected in the Scrutineering Bay before the event. The aim is that every regularly entered vehicle will be physically checked at least once a year.

Drivers whose vehicles are to be scrutineered will be told on arrival at the track.


- 6. Scrutineering will be conducted in a COVID-safe way.
 - Drivers will be responsible for opening vehicle doors, bonnets, boots etc. Scrutineers will use PPE (hand sanitiser, disposable gloves and masks).
- 7. Random checks of driver apparel (principally helmets) can be done in the pits at any time.

A cumulative list of the number vehicles which have been checked each year will be on the club website and the Chief Scrutineer will report on each event in the following month's *Over The Hill.* The report will include number of vehicles checked and any compliance/safety issues which the scrutineers have observed.

As has always been the case

- any vehicle that activates the noise meter during a run must be physically scrutineered before being allowed to compete again at that event;
- any vehicle about which the Chief Scrutineer has safety or engineering concerns can be scrutineered at any time during an event.

COVID CONDITIONS OF ENTRY



When you enter the track, either at the competitors' gate or the spectator footpath, you'll now see this large sign setting out the conditions on which the club grants entry to the circuit.

It's pretty straight forward. Everyone coming into the venue must register using the **Check-in CBR** QR app.

We are required by the ACT Government to keep a record of everyone who visits the hillclimb during an event.

So please make sure you sign in, and make sure your friends, pit crew or visitors have signed in, too.

If you see someone walking in without checking in electronically, please ask them to check in straight away.

We can only have spectators if we manage our venue properly – and that means everyone has to follow the rules.

Please help us to ensure the club can keep running events. If you have any issues relating to this, or you think someone may have entered the venue without registering, please talk to Kim Le Lievre, the nominated COVID checker.

WE'RE BUILDING A TIMEKEEPING TEAM

Hillclimbing is overwhelmingly about time: If we don't have accurate run results to boast or complain about, it might be a bit pointless.

For many, many years, the club's legendary Dave King has been the keeper of time, measuring our performances to one thousandth of a second. But Dave is easing out of being the guardian of the timing system and David Deaves is stepping into his shoes. For which SDMA is very appreciative.

But the good Mr Deaves wants to keep competing, which means he will have to leave the timekeeper's chair in the tower at least five times every event to get behind the wheel of the mighty GTS. So we need some timing assistants to build a timing team to work with him to cover the whole event and give the club back-up for days when David isn't available.

We're looking for members with enthusiasm and patience to develop the skills of this essential role and who enjoy being at the centre of the action.
