SEPTEMBER 12 HILLCLIMB CANCELLED

First the bad news.....

Because of the extension of the ACT lockdown, the club one lap hillclimb scheduled for Sunday 12 September has been cancelled.

The event was originally scheduled for Sunday 5 September, but in a burst of optimism the club postponed it until 12 September. Unfortunately, our optimism was misplaced.

Now some better news......

A replacement one lap event will be held on Sunday 21 November, so please put that date in your calendar.

OCTOBER LONG WEEKEND HILLCLIMB

The October long weekend hillclimb IS STILL ON. But it has changed.

The event was meant to be a round of the NSW HillClimb Championship, so we would have seen some of the best hillclimb drivers and vehicles from across the state. But the lockdowns in Greater Sydney and regional NSW have made trying to hold a state-wide event almost impossible.

The event will now be a club single lap hillclimb on Sunday 3 October.

Entries will open when the Motorsport Australia event permit is received. Members will be advised by a general club e-mail and a post on the club Facebook page.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT



The uncertainty and disruption created by the continuing COVID lockdowns in the ACT, NSW and Victoria are affecting SDMA along with the rest of the community.

> As explained elsewhere in this *Over The Hill* the main immediate impacts on the club are:

- The 12 September one lap event (which had already been postponed from 5 September because of the lockdown) has been cancelled and replaced with a single lap event on Sunday 21 November.
- The Annual General Meeting, scheduled for Sunday 19 September, has been postponed to Sunday 24 October.
- The State Round event on the October long weekend (Saturday 2 and Sunday 3 October) will now be solely a club hillclimb on Sunday 3 October, rather than a round of the NSW HillClimb Championship.

So there will be appeals for club members to work as flag marshals, general officials, chocks and in many other ways. If you can help out, either by coming out for a day or half a day or, if you're competing, by stepping in between runs, please do so. We will need as many people as possible.

Please keep checking the website and the club Facebook page for updates to what is happening.

A less visible impact of the lockdown has been our inability to keep working on the new Event Administration Centre, which is a great disappointment. When we can safely hold working bees for the Event Administration Centre project and other tasks around the circuit there will be shout outs for help using club e-mails, the Facebook page and the website. Please keep an eye out for them and, if you can help, please come on out.

When we start events again in October, COVID won't have gone away. So following COVID protocols such as social distancing and using hand sanitiser will continue to be very important at the track, as well as observing the legal requirement to sign in with the *Check In CBR* app.

I look forward to seeing a big turnout at the October and November events. In the meantime, I hope everyone stays very safe.



TWO IMPORTANT REMINDERS FOR COMPETITORS

• Drivers must wear natural fibre clothing (the most common natural fibre being cotton) which covers the driver from ankle to neck to wrist.

The requirement that clothing must come down to the driver's wrist means just that: *it must reach the wrist – not stop near the elbow or 10 or 15 centimetres above the wrist*. There are obvious safety issues, principally fire related, for this requirement so please follow the rules.





Once an event has started, competition cars are not permitted to leave the hillclimb without the express, prior permission of the Clerk of Course. If

permission is granted, which will only be in rare circumstances, the car must be taken to the Chief Scrutineer for re-checking immediately on return to the circuit.

• The Supplementary Regulations have been revised to make this clear. Para 29 now says:

Competition vehicles must not leave the event venue without the express prior permission of the Clerk of Course. If permission is granted, the vehicle must be presented to the Chief Scrutineer for re-scrutiny immediately upon return to the event.

• Competitors should only compete in one event a day. Entering in both a hillclimb and another nearby event means having to frequently leave the hillclimb to alternate between the two events, which raises a number of issues for both.

MAKING SURE YOUR ENTRY IS CORRECT

Most competitors know which Type and sub-class their car should be entered in at an event, but sometimes mistakes happen. New drivers aren't sure, an established driver gets a new car or someone hits the wrong key when filling in their on-line entry form.

We've had a few mistakes lately so, on the principle of it's better to be safe than sorry, *please check your entry carefully before pressing the submit button*.

An important point is that SDMA refers to generic competition classes as Types. So in general terms Type = competition class. Engine capacity then determines the subclasses of a Type.

If you're unsure about your car's Type, the first port of call is the club website.

Go to **Competitor Information**, click on the "**Vehicle Types and Classes**" tab on the right hand side of the page and it will open a page headed "**What Hillclimb Class am I in?**" This gives a good step by step summary of the considerations which determine the Type for your car.

For a more detailed explanation, click on the "**Full Types and Classes**" tab on the right hand side of the page.

If you are still unsure, get in touch with the Event Secretary whose contact details are listed in both the Event Supplementary Regulations (the "Supp Regs" you hear everyone talking about and which you are required to read before each event) and the online entry form, both of which are part of the Online Entry System.

And if, after all this, you still have questions, feel free to ask the Event Secretary or the Chief Scrutineer on the day, BUT BEFORE THE EVENT STARTS.

Roles and Responsibilities of SDMA Committee Members

President—coordinates the management of the club, chairs committee meetings and is SDMA's main representative when dealing with outside bodies (e.g. Motorsport Australia, ACT Government)

Vice President—assists the President and, if the President is absent or incapacitated, acts as President.

Secretary—manages general business including receiving and sending correspondence; issues notices of meetings, writes the minutes of committee meetings and the Annual General Meeting.

Treasurer—manages the club's finances and maintains the club's financial records. At each committee meeting, the Treasurer submits a financial report on the position of the club, including payments and receipts since the previous committee meeting. The Treasurer provides the club's external Auditor with all information necessary to enable the Auditor to prepare Audited Financial Statements for the financial year ended 30 June, which are presented at the Annual General Meeting.

Membership Secretary— maintains the Membership Register and processes membership renewals and new membership requests.

Club Captain— in conjunction with the Official Timekeeper, maintains the Drivers' Championship point score and track records for Fairbairn Park Hillclimb so that accurate records are available online and in hard copy; works with the Pre-Event Secretary to arrange officials for events.

Pre-Event Secretary— in advance of scheduled events, prepares and submits applications to Motorsport Australia (MA) for MA event permits, nominating key event officials including Event Secretary, Clerk of Course, Stewards and Chief Scrutineer.


Public Officer— responsible for liaison with the ACT Government Office of the Regulatory Services including lodging SDMA's Annual Return; ensures SDMA complies with the *Incorporated Associations Act*; must be an ACT resident.

Assistant Secretary—assists the Secretary in taking and preparing Minutes of proceedings and resolutions passed at Committee meetings.

Magazine Editor—prepares Over The Hill for publication each month and works with the club's social media team to ensure information for members available in print and on-line is consistent and timely.

Publicity Officer—undertakes public relations and liaises with electronic and print media about club activities, particularly advance publicity for events.

General Committee Members—work with the executive office bearers (President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer) and can chair sub-committees formed by the Committee. Can have continuing or ad hoc 'portfolio' roles e.g. Facilities Manager; SDMA representatives on the Fairbairn Park Control Council; maintaining and developing SDMA's social media presence; and raising sponsorship for key events such as SDMA's annual round of the NSW HillClimb Championship.

Chief Scrutineer's Report

Round Five - One Lap Hillclimb - Sunday 1 August 2021

The scrutineering team – and SDMA generally - welcomes back Norm Sutton, who has returned to Canberra after living on the Gold Coast for some years. Norm is a keen driver having previously competed in numerous SDMA events in vehicles such as a Porsche 911, Nissan GT-R, Evo 10 and a Golf R.

Twelve vehicles were inspected by the scrutineering team, the checks being carried out under the club's 'Managed Scrutineering' system introduced in March this year, which checks first time entrants (both cars and drivers) and around 10 per cent of other competitors' vehicles.

The vehicle safety standard was good, with the scrutineered '*vehicle of choice*' for the day going to Jeffery Camm in his developed Nissan Sylvia.

One issue which arose during the day was vehicle noise, with three competitors having runs disallowed because their vehicle exceeded the circuit noise limit. Competitors are reminded that the maximum noise level for SDMA club events is 87dBa.

Vehicles competing in club events at the Canberra HillClimb must be below 87dBa. SDMA is legally obliged to be able to demonstrate compliance, at every event, with the ACT Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) noise management regulations for the Fairbairn Park motorsport precinct.

The club's vehicle noise management processes are:

- If a vehicle exceeds the noise limit during a competition run, that run is disallowed.
- The vehicle cannot compete in further runs on the day until modifications have been made to reduce the noise to below the allowable limits and those modifications are approved by the Chief Scrutineer and Clerk of Course.
- If, on a subsequent run, the vehicle still exceeds the noise limit, the vehicle is excluded from the remainder of that day's event.
- If the vehicle is entered for a subsequent event, the entry will be accepted **subject to the vehicle being inspected on the day and the competitor providing evidence of substantial and permanent work to rectify the noise problem**.
- SDMA reserves the right **not to accept an entry** from a competitor proposing to use a vehicle which has been the subject of noise compliance issues at previous events.

These processes are in place to protect the club and to protect the ability of all members to be able to compete in club level motorsport.

Vehicles with anti-lag devices that emit bangs on throttle lift-off are not encouraged, and vehicles emitting inadequately muffled bangs will be advised to remedy the issue.

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EVENT REPORT - ONE LAP HILLCLIMB SUNDAY 1 AUGUST 2021: ROUND 5 OF THE ACT HILL CLIMB CHAMPIONSHIP

At the end of the day, the general feeling was: "We had a much better day than we expected at 9 o'clock this morning." After a very unpromising start to the day - wet, cold and windy – the club's first event for two months got better and better as the day went on and the track, drivers and spectators all warmed up. We even had a new class record set.

60 competitors lined up in the rain and the first run in particular was taken carefully by everyone. The track was cold and slippery and the operative word was 'caution', with the run times reflecting that. Conditions improved throughout the morning and the times came down. By the last two runs in the afternoon (Run 4 and Run 5), the differences in times from the morning runs were very large, in many cases around the 8 to 10 second marks.

As the weather improved, so did everyone's spirits and competitive fire. One of the closest battles of the day was Type 1/2 up to 1600cc, with Martin Crombie in the Gemini chasing Jamie Ericson's Excel all day, with Martin pipping Jamie by 0.47 seconds on the last run to win the class with time of 53.34 seconds.



• Fastest Time of the Day was set by Matthew Brown in the Audi RS4, with a result of 44.87 seconds, which also gave him the class win for Type AWD/SV3 Over 3000cc.

• Fastest Female Driver was McKelvy Reed in her Subaru WRX STi, also in Type AWD/SV3 Over 3000cc, with a time of 51.83 seconds.





• Fastest Junior Driver was Tom Donohue in Type 4 1601-2000cc, who took the Toyota 86 he shared with younger brother Toby around in 49.46 seconds.

Type AWD 1/2 2001-3000cc (the 'Yaris class') produced the new class record, with Iain Chandler taking his GR around in 46.28 seconds, cutting his own record (which he only set in May this year) by 0.41 seconds. Watching Iain, Colin Chandler and Warren Spires in their identical pocket rockets is very entertaining but, at times, confusing given how similar the cars are in appearance.

The full results of the event are, as always, on the club website, accessible through the '*Results*' tab at the top of the home page. The full and complete results are generally posted to the website within a day or two of each event.

Like any event the club runs, we couldn't have done it without a team of dedicated officials and volunteer. COVID CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

When you enter the track, either through the competitors' gate or the spectator footpath, there are laminated signs setting out the conditions on which the club grants entry to the circuit.

They're simple: **Everyone coming into the venue must register on arrival using the** *Check-in CBR* **QR app**. So there are SDMA specific QR symbols at both entrances and around the track.

Please use them and check in.

We are required by ACT Government Public Health Orders to ensure everyone at the hillclimb during an event - drivers, officials, pit crew and spectators- signs in using the app. There are no exceptions.

With what is happening now in Greater Sydney makes the reasons for compulsory signing are obvious.
