
# OVER THE HILL

# Event report ROUND 6 - SUNDAY, 10 SEPTEMBER 2023

Brrr..... it was a cold morning!! Minus six at the gate as competitors and officials arrived but the weather gods were with SDMA again and it turned into a beautiful dry and sunny spring Canberra day, appreciated by all.

50 competitors lined up and the slightly smaller than normal field meant six runs were offered, as happened at the August event. 40 drivers took advantage of the 'extra' run.

Four new class records were set.

The two stars of the day were **Andrew Ericson**, who undercut the old record for Class A Road - 2WD 0 - 1600cc of 51.32 seconds in four of his six runs, dropping it to 50.76 seconds, and **Colin Chandler**, who lowered the mark for Class C Road - AWD 2001 - 3000cc from 48.35 seconds to 47.26 seconds, also undercutting the old record in four of his six runs. Congratulations Andrew and Colin.

The other new class records were set by **Aaron Domio**, who lowered the mark for Class F Track - Sports Sedan Over 3000cc from 46.93 seconds to 46.62 seconds in his third run and **Matthew Brown**, who cut the record for Class E Road - SV Over 3000cc from 43.59 seconds to 43.53 seconds - twice! - in his first and fifth runs. Congratulations to Aaron and Matthew.

Those two identical times gave Matthew the Fastest Time of the Day. Some churlish people might think that setting the same FTD twice is the motorsport version of showing off.

## **NSW CHAMPS: MY TAKE (PART 3)**

Round 4 of the NSW Hillclimb Championship saw us travel to Mt Cooperabung, just south of Kempsey. A track that once was the Pacific Highway and full of history, now turned Hillclimb track, was a blast. Although short, it did not lack a level of complexity that if gotten wrong, can bite you at any moment.

Practice started at 12pm on Saturday with an opportunity to knock out as many runs as you could fit in. The current class record stands at 25.724 set by (surprise, surprise) an R35 Nissan GTR in 2017.

I was determined to break into the 25s bracket during practice and on the 9th run, it finally came with a run time of 25.991.

With the goal achieved, we packed up and went to our hotel for the night.

Sunday morning (competition day) was cool, with the track lacking the same grip experienced the day before. With so many runs had on the Saturday during practice, it was soon discovered the brake pads were not up to the task of stopping after coming into the hairpin after the chicane on the first run. Thankfully I managed to pull the car up and avoided running into the tyre barrier but ended with a run time of 26.869.

With this run time, I was forced into second place by the newly improved RS4 of Daniel Son after he posted a solid first run time of 26.655.

## Round 4: Mr Cooperabung (Kempsey) continued...

Run two saw a similar situation with stopping not as it was the day before.

The best I could muster for this run was a 26.182, which put me slightly ahead of the other RS4 which ran a 26.406.

Thankfully I had my street/ light track pads with me but unfortunately, I missed run three whilst I frantically changed brake pads on searing hot brakes.

Jason (AKA Daniel Son) posted a respectful time of 26.463 on his third run.

Run four was sadly a 26.370 as I felt out the abilities of the new pad compound, which lacked the same initial bite and confidence-inspiring stopping power of the track pads.

The fifth and final run turned out to be an 'all or nothing' run after Daniel in his RS4 jumped ahead with blistering time of 26.126.

Focused on giving it everything I and the car had, I set off one last time. Making it through the chicane with only a small lift, I was able to get back onto the power early and to the

hairpin at a top speed of 160kph.

Coming in slightly faster than before, I managed to pull the car up a little more than potentially needed which cost me speed and time.

Although slow into the hairpin, I was able to get out faster, and carry more speed into the final right hander that requires considerable feathering of the throttle as it sweeps around before then getting back on the power at just the right moment.

Clawing for ground at every opportunity, I crossed the finish line in a time of 25.902 which secured 1st in class, 2nd outright (state comp) and fastest tintop of the day.

With these results, it has now moved us into

2nd outright in the state championship, 1st in class and moved us even further ahead as the state championships fastest tintop.

Thank you must be said once again to my unwavering pit crew, family and close friends who make these trips so amazing and memorable.

For anyone who looking for a new challenge or just wants to test your skills on a new track, I cannot encourage the NSW Hillclimb Championship enough. It will definitely be in my 2024 motorsport calendar, along with as many local rounds as I can possibly do!

# TRACK WORKS BY COL MERZ

#### New toilet block

Despite the winter weather and the shorter days, good progress has been made with all the wall frames fabricated and stood up, roof rafters cut to fit and installed. We were waiting for a nice calm day to install the plywood ceiling lining, sisalation and the corrugated metal roofing but no such luck and the task was attempted on Saturday 19 August, a cold and windy winter's day. A very hardy team of four volunteers got the job done without incident, perhaps more by good luck than good management. As can be seen in the photo, the building is really taking shape.



#### Spectator car park

I must admit it has been neglected. Some temporary repairs have been made to the entry road and some of the more serious erosion ruts to make it a little more accessible for road cars. The good news is that our hard working Event Secretary, Celeste Oringo, has again stepped up to the plate and offered to design a layout to accommodate the maximum number of cars for the area. We now have to accurately measure the area so Celeste has something to work with and then we would then have a plan that we can share with members.

#### Roller doors

We had plans of fitting roller doors into the sides of our new 40 foot containers and we had 3 roller doors generously donated to the club. However, we have changed our plans and the roller doors are now surplus to our needs. If any club member could use these doors, we would pass them on at no cost. They are 2650mm wide and the tracks are 2270mm long (or high as they would be installed);

## CAMERAS ON HELMETS

TLDR; If you want to use a camera helmet, the helmet must be homologated to FIA Standards 8858, 8859, and 8860 and it must be approved by the Chief Scrutineer before your first run.

The event Supp Regs require cameras in or on cars to be approved by the Chief Scrutineer before competition starts. The same is true of cameras mounted in or on drivers' helmets.

Only helmets with cameras and accessories homologated to FIA Standards 8858, 8859, and 8860 are accepted by Motorsport Australia (and hence SDMA). The FIA homologation sticker is found inside the helmet padding. These are the only helmets that can be used with a camera installed. The technical requirements are on the Motorsport Australia website.

There are obvious implications for the structural integrity and strength of helmets with unapproved mounts and consequent safety risks for the driver. But even if you think you have an FIA homologated helmet, it must be shown to the Chief Scrutineer for approval before the event starts, regardless of whether your car is listed for scrutineering on the day.

# Drones are a no-no at the track

The hillclimb is directly under the flight path for Canberra Airport and, by law, the Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA) regulates flightpath airspace - from the ground up.

CASA regulations ban drones from operating under the flight path, which means that drones are not permitted to fly at the track, even supposedly lightweight ones.

Please don't ask for permission to run your drone during an event: the club can't give it.

The matter is totally outside of our control.

# ATTENTION: ALL ENTRANTS

You must be a current financial member of SDMA to compete.

- You must have a current Motorsport Australia Speed licence to compete.
- You must use an approved safety helmet
   ("Competitors' Information" section of the club website
   www.sdmahillclimb.com.au/competitors has details of approved types).
- Your vehicle must be roadworthy and safe and meet the safety requirements

(See "Competitors' Information" section www.sdmahillclimb.com.au/competitors for more info).

 Drivers must wear long pants and long-sleeved shirts (made from a natural fibre such as cotton) and enclosed footwear.

No shorts, no t-shirts. Any clothing, including footwear, made of flammable synthetic material (eg. nylon) is not acceptable.

 If your car has a Motorsport Australia logbook you must have, and use, a compliant frontal head restraint (FHR)

(aka a HANS device).

 Provide your own COVID personal protective equipment such as hand sanitiser and face masks (if you want to wear one).



## ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF SDMA COMMITTEE MEMBERS

President—coordinates the management of the club, chairs committee meetings and is SDMA's main representative when dealing with outside bodies (e.g. Motorsport Australia, ACT Government)

Vice President—assists the President and, if the President is absent or incapacitated, acts as President.

**Secretary**—manages general business including receiving and sending correspondence; issues notices of meetings, writes the minutes of committee meetings and the Annual General Meeting.

Treasurer—manages the club's finances and maintains the club's financial records. At each committee meeting, the Treasurer submits a financial report on the position of the club, including payments and receipts since the previous committee meeting. The Treasurer provides the club's external Auditor with all information necessary to enable the Auditor to prepare Audited Financial Statements for the financial year ended 30 June, which are presented at the Annual General Meeting.

Membership Secretary— maintains the Membership Register and processes membership renewals and new membership requests.

Club Captain— in conjunction with the Official Timekeeper, maintains the Drivers'
Championship point score and track records for Fairbairn Park Hillclimb so that accurate records are available online and in hard copy; works with the Pre-Event Secretary to arrange officials for events.

Pre-Event Secretary— in advance of scheduled events, prepares and submits applications to Motorsport Australia (MA) for MA event permits, nominating key event officials including Event Secretary, Clerk of Course, Stewards and Chief Scrutineer.

Public Officer— responsible for liaison with the ACT Government Office of the Regulatory Services including lodging SDMA's Annual Return; ensures SDMA complies with the Incorporated Associations Act; must be an ACT resident.

Assistant Secretary—assists the Secretary in taking and preparing Minutes of proceedings and resolutions passed at Committee meetings.

Magazine Editor—prepares Over The Hill for publication each month and works with the club's social media team to ensure information for members available in print and on-line is consistent and timely.

Publicity Officer—undertakes public relations and liaises with electronic and print media about club activities, particularly advance publicity for events.

General Committee Members—work with the executive office bearers (President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer) and can chair sub-committees formed by the Committee. Can have continuing or ad hoc 'portfolio' roles e.g. Facilities Manager; SDMA representatives on the Fairbairn Park Control Council; maintaining and developing SDMA's social media presence; raising sponsorship for key events like SDMA's annual round of the NSW HillClimb

Championship.
