Santa and his helpers (also known as the club committee) look forward to welcoming lots of club members and their families.



That's what's happening to the noise limits for events in 2023 and beyond.

From Round 1 of the club championship in 2023 the maximum noise limit (as measured at the SDMA noise meter) will reduce from 87 dBA to 85 dBA.

The change was recommended by the committee and endorsed at the recent AGM.

How well we manage noise created at the track is critical to the club's future. As has previously been explained in *Over The Hill*, SDMA operates under an ACT Government noise management authorisation that covers the whole Fairbairn Park motorsport precinct. The authorisation limits the amount of noise that can be generated, how often events can be held and for how long. It is the foundation of all our planning.

Calculating the amount and impact of the noise generated is complex and is more than just the data produced by the sound meter at the track. It involves measuring at the track and further measurement and impact monitoring at a compliance site in Queanbeyan, about a kilometre to the east of the track. The two sets of data establish a relationship which determines the overall impact of the noise that has been created.

SDMA monitors noise at each event, with noise currently limited to 87dBA at the measuring point having been determined to ensure the noise at the compliance site doesn't exceed 50dBA (as allowed for by the use of 1 noise credit).

The Committee believed it would be prudent for SDMA to show the club's commitment to managing noise from the track by reducing the maximum noise allowed to 85dBA at each club event commencing on 1 January 2023.

This will not affect many competitors but it will mean that a few will need to modify their vehicles between the last round in 2022 and the first round in 2023.

If you think you may be affected you should make the necessary changes as soon as you can. There will NOT be any allowances in the Supplementary Regulations for excessive noise in events in 2023. If you exceed 85dba you will have to make a physical change to your vehicle and obtain the approval of the Chief Scrutineer and the Clerk of the Course before you can run again – if you are still over the limit unfortunately that's it for the day.

CHANGES TO SDMA TYPES AND CLASSES

SDMA's vehicle Type and Class structure will change from the beginning of 2023.

The new arrangements will better suit the types of cars that are competing in SDMA events and are more broadly consistent with *Motorsport Australia* classifications and categories.

We will no longer have Types and Classes, which were often confusing. From 1 January 2023 we will have only Classes, split into *Road Classes*, for primarily road registered or road registerable vehicles, or *Track Classes*, for purpose built race cars or vehicles so heavily modified as to not be able to be road registered.

There will be five Road Classes (Class A to Class E) and three Track Classes (Class F to Class H). Each Class will have four engine capacity-determined subclasses.

The new structure is set out in the table below. The final column in the table shows which current Types each new Class replaces.

Full explanations of the new Classes will be loaded to the club website by 1 December, **after** this weekend's one lap event.

Some important things to note

1. Engine capacity calculations

Multipliers apply to rotary engines and turbo/supercharged engines to calculate effective capacity for classification purposes:

- Petrol turbo/supercharged have the engine capacity multiplied by 1.7
- Diesel turbo/supercharged have the engine capacity multiplied by 1.5

CHANGES TO SDMA TYPES AND CLASSES (continued)

- Rotaries have the engine capacity multiplied by 1.8.
- Turbo/supercharged rotaries have the engine capacity multiplied by 1.8 then 1.7 (net multiplier equals 3.06)

Examples:

- 2 litre petrol motor with a turbo/supercharger is 2000cc x 1.7 = 3400cc.
- 13B rotary is 1308cc x 1.8 = 2354.4cc
- 13B rotary with a turbo/supercharger is 1308cc x 1.8 x 1.7 = 4002.48cc

2. Classes A - E road registered/road registerable vehicles must use road tyres.

"Road tyres" must be commercially available and do NOT include Racing tyres (including slicks or wets) specifically marked as being illegal or unsafe/unsuitable for road use, such as: "For Racing Only" or "Not for Highway Use". It should be noted that Nitto uses a term "Recommended for competition use only". This is not considered by SDMA to be a specific exclusion from road use.

- 3. Vehicles classed as "Exotic" under the Motorsport Australia definition (ie purchase price) are not eligible for Classes A –D.
- 4. Classes E and F may be AWD.
- 5. Vehicles must be entered in the first class that they comply with.

If a car complies with Class A requirements it must be entered as Class A and cannot be entered in Class B, C, D, E, F, G or H.

As mentioned above, full details of the new Classes will be available on the club website by 1 December, *after* this weekend's one lap event.



The calendar for next year has 11 events (12 if you count the half day practice session the day before the 8 October one lapper), including two lap events in June and November.

We are not hosting a round of the NSW HillClimb Championship so that means **there will be nine** rounds of the ACT HillClimb Championship.

The first event is Sunday 5 February and the last is Sunday 19 November. There is no event in July.

Elsewhere in this issue of *Over The Hill* there are important stories which affect all events next year:

- The noise limit for club events has been reduced from 87 dB to 85 dB;
- The Type and Class structure has been revised to eliminate some incongruities and to bring our Types and Classes more closely in line with *MotorSport Australia* categories; and
- We will no longer be awarding prizes at events for the Fastest Female Competitor and the Fastest Junior Competitor. Instead there will be an award for the Fastest New Competitor at each event, new competitors being defined as members who have taken part in fewer than five events.

These changes all come into effect from the first round next year.

The calendar will be published in every issue of *Over The Hill* in 2023. There may be changes during the year if circumstances alter. If there are changes, the calendar will be updated in the next issue of *Over The Hill*. So please check the calendar each month when *OTH* is published.

As at 13 November 2022, the 2023 calendar is on the next page.

2022 SDMA ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING (AGM) OUTCOMES

The 2022 AGM was held at 2.00 pm on Sunday 23 October in the *Pit Stop Café*, as advised to members in the August, September and October issues of *Over The Hill* and by flyer at the hillclimb on 16 October. The Agenda and related papers were circulated to members by e-mail in the week before the AGM.

The draft Minutes from the meeting will be posted to the club website in coming weeks. The Minutes are draft until they are considered and adopted at the next AGM, due in September-October next year.

Thirteen members attended which met the quorum requirement of the club constitution (Clause 27.7)

The main outcomes of the AGM were:

- The adoption of the President's Report for 2021-2022
- The adoption of the Audited Financial Statements for 2021-2022
- Appointment of the club's independent auditor:
 - Canberra Accountancy & Audit Pty Ltd was re-engaged
- The election of a new club committee, including the executive:
 - A list of committee members is at the end of this article
- Setting membership fees and event entry fees for the coming year:
 - Membership fees are unchanged from 2021-2022
 - Event entry fees are unchanged from 2021-2022
- Endorsement of a revised Type and Class structure to take effect from 1 January 2023:
 - This is explained in a separate article in this issue of Over The Hill
- Agreement to lower the noise limit for SDMA club events from 87 dBA to 85 dBA with effect from 1 January 2023:
 - This is explained in a separate article in this issue of Over The Hill
- The club introduce 'mentoring/buddy' arrangements to help new competitors become familiar with event procedures and driving techniques needed for the track
 - These could include attaching a link to a video simulation of a lap of the track to entry confirmation e-mails, discussing with our regular Clerks of Course reinstating a 'sighting' lap for genuine first time competitors, promotion of the driver skills briefings given before each event by Morgan McBride and developing a more detailed drivers' briefing for first time competitors.

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
BIG SHOES TO FILL

EVENT REPORT - HEARTKIDS HILLCLIMB SUNDAY 6 NOVEMBER 2022

A great day for a great event as the HeartKids HillClimb returned. The track was bustling with competitors, HeartKids workers, SDMA officials, spectators and, most importantly, the HeartKids themselves. It was a fun-filled, happy day, enjoyed by all.

The two lap hillclimb itself was a great success: four runs, three new class records and plenty of parade laps when competitors could take the HeartKids on low speed (controlled low speed!!) laps of the track to share the experience of being in a hillclimb car.

The enthusiasm for the HeartKids event is palpable: it starts when the On-Line Entry System fills up in about 30 minutes and continues as competitors keenly order their special *HeartKids HillClimb 2022 shirts* and other merchandise. It comes to a head on the day with long lines of competition cars waiting to take our special visitors on the parade laps.

It's still a serious event though, with drivers putting in maximum effort. The new class records were set by:



EASING OF COVID RESTRICTIONS

The ACT Government eased COVID restrictions so it is no longer mandatory for people coming to hillclimbs (drivers, pit crews, officials or spectators) to check in electronically using the *Check In CBR* app and QR code.

However the government wishes organisations to continue to display the *Check in CBR* QR code for voluntary use by members of the community. So the posters with the SDMA QR symbol remain around the track.

SDMA encourages everyone to follow general community COVID precautions such as observing social distancing, using hand sanitiser when appropriate and wearing masks if they wish. These general precautions are set out in the revised SDMA COVID-19 Conditions of Entry, which are displayed at both entrances to the track (competitors and spectators) and around the central Pit Stop Café area.

SDMA SCRUTINEERING ARRANGEMENTS

- 1. Before COVID-19, SDMA practice was that every car was scrutineered before every event.
- 2. Motorsport Australia's 'Return To Race' COVID management policies stopped physical scrutineering of vehicles at events. Instead competitors are required to complete an on-line self-scrutiny declaration when submitting an event entry.
 - Because of concerns about the time between a competitor completing the on-line self-scrutiny
 form at time of entry and their vehicle lining up at an event, SDMA developed the SDMA
 Statement of Vehicle Compliance, which competitors must hand in on arrival at the track on the
 day of the event. It requires the competitor to confirm that they have examined their vehicle in
 the 72 hours before the event and certify that it still meets the standards set out in the on-line
 self-scrutiny declaration.
- 3. COVID restrictions have eased but SDMA has not returned to an 'every car, every event' approach. Instead, SDMA has adopted the following scrutineering policy:

On-Line Entry

- (1). Only on-line entries are accepted. This is no change from pre-COVID.
- (2). Competitors are required to complete the **Motorsport Australia on-line self-scrutiny declaration** when submitting an entry.
- (3). Competitors are required to complete the **SDMA Statement of Vehicle Compliance** and hand it in when arriving at the track on the day of the event.

Before the Event starts

- (1). Any **vehicle** entered for the first time will be scrutineered in the Scrutineering Bay before the event starts. This applies even if the driver has competed previously.
- (2). Any **driver** competing for the first time must take their vehicle to the Scrutineering Bay to be scrutineered before the event starts. This applies even if the vehicle has competed at the hillclimb before.
 - Before an event, the Event Secretary and Chief Scrutineer will identify the vehicles to be scrutineered under (1) and (2).
- (3). In addition to vehicles checked under (1) and (2) above, 10 per cent of total entries will be scrutineered before the event starts. The aim is that every regularly entered car will be physically scrutineered at least once a year.

Before an event, the Chief Scrutineer will decide the vehicles to scrutineered under (3).

Drivers whose vehicles are to be scrutineered will be told on arrival at the track.

At scrutineering, drivers will be responsible for opening doors, bonnets, boots etc.

PPE (principally, but not only, disposable gloves and masks) will be provided for scrutineers.

During the Event

- (1). Any vehicle which activates the noise meter must be physically scrutineered before being allowed to compete again.
- (2). The Clerk of Course or the Chief Scrutineer (or the Chief Scrutineer's delegate) can require any vehicle to be physically scrutineered.
- (3). Random checks of driver apparel (principally helmets) can be done at any time.



REMINDERS FOR ALL HILLCLIMB ENTRANTS

- You must be a *current* financial member of SDMA to compete. If your membership has expired please contact the Membership Secretary, Ross Samuelson, at sdmamembership20@gmail.com. For 2022, membership is \$55 for individuals and \$75 for families.
- You must have a current Motorsport Australia (MA) Speed licence to compete.
- You must have, and use, a Motorsport Australia approved safety helmet (see the "Competitors' Information" section of the club website https://www.sdmahillclimb.com.au/competitors for details of approved types).
- Your vehicle must be roadworthy and safe to compete and meet the safety requirements set out in the "Competitors' Information" section of the club website https://www.sdmahillclimb.com.au/competitors.
- Drivers must wear long trousers (no shorts) and long sleeved shirts made from a natural fibre such as cotton (no tee shirts), and enclosed footwear. Any clothing, including footwear, made of flammable synthetic material, such as nylon for example, is not acceptable.
- If your car has a Motorsport Australia logbook you must have, and must use, a



Motorsport Australia compliant frontal head restraint (FHR), previously known as a HANS device.

- There is no requirement to have or use a FHR if you are driving a road registered car or an unregistered vehicle which does not have a Motorsport Australia logbook.
- You will need to provide your own COVID personal protective equipment such as hand sanitiser, disposable gloves and face masks (if you want to wear one). There are hand sanitising stations around the track..
