The **HeartKids Hillclimb** came about in 2009 when I wanted to do something to celebrate what would have been my little brother William's 21st birthday.

Will was born premature with a complex, chromosome syndrome. As part of his health problem, he had a congenital heart defect and doctors weren't sure he would survive for days, never mind the 12 and a half years we got to spend together.

Will was passionate about racing cars. He had a collection of 100s of matchbox cars and loved playing racing games on the Playstation. Getting his learner's license and driving a cool black car was the last thing we spoke about in hospital just before he passed away.

When I was fortunate enough to get my own black race car, I dedicated it to Will, promoting HeartKids and the work they do to support others like my little brother.

For the first HeartKids Hillclimb in 2009, SDMA allowed us to use a club round to raise money and support for HeartKids, since then the HeartKids Hillclimb has been a stand-alone 2 lap event with the facilities provided by SDMA. A big hit has been the ability to do Parade laps in the race cars to give kids a chance to experience the track

The event has raised over \$140,000 for HeartKids to help their work supporting children with heart conditions and their families. We have also taken 100's of kids for rides around the track and spread the word about the great work HeartKids do.

I want to extend a big thank you to all the competitors, officials, volunteers, sponsors and SDMA for supporting the event.

Looking forward to seeing everyone out at the 2022 HeartKids Hillclimb on Sunday 6th November!

Roles and Responsibilities of SDMA Committee Members

President—coordinates the management of the club, chairs committee meetings and is SDMA's main representative when dealing with outside bodies (e.g. *Motorsport Australia*, ACT Government)

Vice President—assists the President and, if the President is absent or incapacitated, acts as President.

Secretary—manages general business including receiving and sending correspondence; issues notices of meetings, writes the minutes of committee meetings and the Annual General Meeting.

Treasurer—manages the club's finances and maintains the club's financial records. At each committee meeting, the Treasurer submits a financial report on the position of the club, including payments and receipts since the previous committee meeting. The Treasurer provides the club's external Auditor with all information necessary to enable the Auditor to prepare Audited Financial Statements for the financial year ended 30 June, which are presented at the Annual General Meeting.

Membership Secretary— maintains the Membership Register and processes membership renewals and new membership requests.

Club Captain— in conjunction with the Official Timekeeper, maintains the Drivers' Championship point score and track records for Fairbairn Park Hillclimb so that accurate records are available online and in hard copy; works with the Pre-Event Secretary to arrange officials for events.

Pre-Event Secretary— in advance of scheduled events, prepares and submits applications to Motorsport Australia (MA) for MA event permits, nominating key event officials including Event Secretary, Clerk of Course, Stewards and Chief Scrutineer.

Public Officer— responsible for liaison with the ACT Government Office of the Regulatory Services including lodging SDMA's Annual Return; ensures SDMA complies with the *Incorporated Associations Act*; must be an ACT resident.


Assistant Secretary—assists the Secretary in taking and preparing Minutes of proceedings and resolutions passed at Committee meetings.

Magazine Editor—prepares *Over The Hill* for electronic publication each month and works with the club President and social media team to ensure information for members is available in a timely and consistent manner.

Publicity Officer—undertakes public relations and liaises with electronic and print media about club activities, particularly advance publicity for events.

General Committee Members—work with the executive office bearers (President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer) and can chair sub-committees formed by the Committee. Can have continuing or ad hoc 'portfolio' roles e.g. Facilities Manager; SDMA representatives on the Fairbairn Park Control Council; maintaining and developing SDMA's social media presence; and raising sponsorship for key events such as SDMA's annual round of the NSW HillClimb Championship.


BIG SHOES TO FILL

EVENT REPORT - ROUND 7 OF THE NSW HILLCLIMB CHAMPIONSHIP

Saturday 1 October and Sunday 2 October

The NSW HillClimb Championship (NSWHCC) show hit town for the final round of the 2022 series and Canberra turned on welcoming weather for the weekend.

The event ran over two days: timed practice from midday to 4.00 o'clock on Saturday and the serious stuff on Sunday.

That's not to say practice wasn't serious: 40 of the 50 people who had entered for Sunday lined up on Saturday afternoon and, after taking a while to get into the groove of how practice should operate, put in some seriously good times.

The next morning the full field of 50 lined up. It comprised 31 registered NSWHCC competitors – who ran in their championship classes – and 19 SDMA members who weren't NSWHCC competitors and who ran in a single non-championship class - *Multiclub cars (non-championship)*. After five runs, six class records had been broken and a record set for a new class: an impressive haul.

Fastest Time of the Day went to one of the NSWHCC registered competitors, Dave Morrow, in *Formula Libre 751-1300cc*, who took his Krygger Suzuki around in 41.34 seconds.

Dave was pushed all day by SDMA's **Zac LeLievre who finished second outright with 41.57 seconds**, not enough to win FTD but enough to win the *Multiclub cars* (*non-championship*) class and to break the old record for that class of 44.98 seconds.

Second in the *Multiclub cars* (*non-championship*) **was Jeff Nichols**, who took his Westfield SE Clubman round in 45.19 seconds (eighth outright) and **third was Paul Stringfellow** who piloted his VW Golf R to a time of 45.34 seconds (ninth outright).







Among SDMA members competing in the NSWHCC, **John Engisch, Jason Perkins and Matthew Brown** kept the club's colours high by winning their championship classes. John took out *2B Marque sports over 1600cc* in the Mazda MX5 with a time of 48.19 seconds, Matthew won *Road registered non log book AWD* in the Audi RS4 wagon with a time of 43.82 seconds and Jason Perkins won *Road registered non log book over 2501cc* in the Lotus Exige 410 Sport with a time of 44.77 seconds, a new record for the class. Matthew and Jason also took out first and second in the *Fastest Tin Tops* awards.


Jason's class record was costly because after he crossed the finish line the Lotus launched off the track and landed heavily in the infield, hitting the ground pretty forcefully and settling in the sodden conditions until it was extracted from the mud when the event was over.

Fastest Female Driver of the Day was Alison Monkhouse, in the V8 Commodore in championship class *3D Sports sedans 3001-6000cc*. Alison's time was 53.82 seconds.

Fastest Junior Driver of the Day was SDMA's Thomas Davis in the Subaru WRX Sti shared with father Rhys in *Multiclub cars (non-championship)*. Thomas' time was 52.12 seconds.

Staging the State Round was a big effort for the club, involving a lot of extra work over a longer time because of the additional requirements of the NSWHCC class structure and the championship rules. To make the weekend financially viable we had to run a multi-club event to give SDMA members who weren't NSWHCC registered competitors a chance to compete: if we hadn't done that SDMA would have lost money.

The 'behind the scenes' heroes for SDMA in the lead up to the event were Celeste Oringo, Chris Hardy and Kim Le Lievre, who had to manage two separate entry processes with differing classes and timelines, work out running orders that met arcane NSWHCC requirements and then produce a printed event program to keep everyone informed of what was to happen. They did their jobs with great patience and good humour and the club thanks them very much for their outstanding work.

Chief Scrutineer's Report

With two days of activity, it was a busy weekend. Quite a number of vehicles required scrutiny ahead of practice, followed by an early start for Sunday checks and paperwork. All vehicles were inspected and some log book vehicles were given a more thorough inspection as their fourth event for a targeted scrutiny check was due.

The general standard was very good indeed. It was interesting that nearly all NSWHCC vehicles were older models, with mechanically skilled owners dedicated to developing the handling and engine performance, plus their engine bays are a delight to view. This is in contrast to a typical SDMA club event where most vehicles are quite modern.

Overall, owners showed great enthusiasm during the weekend and really enjoyed the Canberra circuit. For classic looks, engine note and total reliability, most impressive was a 1979 Chev Corvette raced by two brothers - Andrew and Michael Frazer - who drove it to the event and ran it hard all Saturday and Sunday. They said they had a fantastic time

MAKING SURE YOUR ENTRY IS CORRECT

Most competitors know which Type and sub-class their car should be entered in at an event, but sometimes mistakes happen. New drivers aren't sure,



an established driver gets a new car or someone hits the wrong key when filling in their on-line entry form.

On the tried and true principle that it's better to be safe than sorry, please **check your entry** carefully before pressing the submit button.

In particular, drivers with an AWD car... please *make sure you scroll down past the 2WD classes* to the AWD listings... quite often people seem to stop at the 2WD equivalent class. So it pays to keep on scrolling!

An important point is that SDMA refers to generic competition classes as Types. So in general terms Type = competition class. Engine capacity then determines the subclasses of a Type.

If you're unsure about your car's Type, the first port of call is the club website www.sdmahillclimb.com.au.

Go to **Competitor Information**, click on the **Vehicle Types and Classes** tab on the right hand side of the page and it will open a page headed **What Hillclimb Class am I in?** This gives a good step by step summary of the considerations which determine the Type for your car.

For a more detailed explanation, click on the **Full Types and Classes** tab on the right-hand side of the page.

If you are still unsure, get in touch with the Event Secretary whose contact details are listed in both the Event Supplementary Regulations (the "Supp Regs" you hear everyone talking about and which you are required to read before each event) and the online entry form, both of which are part of the Online Entry System.

And if, after all this, you still have questions, feel free to ask the Event Secretary or the Chief Scrutineer on the day, BUT BEFORE THE EVENT STARTS.



ROUND 7 OF THE ACT HILLCLIMB CHAMPIONSHIP

SUNDAY 16 OCTOBER 2022

Another good day at the track! We dodged more wet weather (on a day of dreadful floods in northern Victoria and surrounding regions of NSW) with dry, somewhat cloudy conditions but by early afternoon the surface had warmed up enough for three new class records to be set in the last two runs of the day.

51 competitors lined up and five runs were available. There was a very eclectic choice of cars to watch, ranging from Jason Perkins' McLaren 570S through Donovan Suine's truly stunning Lancia Delta (an icon of the 1980s) to Alex Moscaritolo's uncompromising HSV Colorado SportsCat double cab ute. Not to mention two strikingly beautiful red Audi RS4 wagons guaranteed to confuse the less-than-alert spectator.

Fastest Time of the Day went to a visitor who was two weeks late getting to the track but made up for that in great style! **Steve Moxon** originally entered his lovely Talbot 184 in the State Round but family circumstances meant he couldn't compete then so he had to postpone. Steve double entered the car with Searle Courtright in **Type 5 751-1300c**: Steve took first outright with a time 43.39 seconds and Searle was third outright with 44.16 seconds.

Fastest Female Driver of the Day was Tia Schlizio in the Toyota 86 in **Type in 1/2 1601-2000cc**, with a time of 54.78 seconds, which also meant Tia won the class. *Congratulations Tia!*








There was some good family competition across the day as well. Todd Wilson and Toby shared the RX7, with Todd finally prevailing by 1/100th of second – 49.94 to Todd, 49.95 to Toby. Tony, Rebecca and Ryan de Vries kept their Toyota XT busy, with Tony eventually prevailing; and Michael and Mark Suine enthusiastically shared the lovely X1/9, with Michael emerging the winner.

Throughout the day there were many positive comments about changes made to the timing display boards in the PitStop Café and on-track, as a result of work done by Lyall Reid and Chris Hardy to upgrade and integrate the results display system built by Chris many years ago. Chris' system, which put SDMA well and truly ahead of the game when he developed it, took data from the TAG timing system and sent it to the timing boards where it was displayed using Chris' unique software. Working with Chris, Lyall has enhanced its functionality to provide more comparative and live data, allowing drivers to do much more analysis of each of their own runs as well as those of the competition. **Many thanks to Lyall and Chris (again!)**.

Class records were set by

- **Pedro Hietanen** in the TBC 2C Supersports in Type 6 1301-2000cc, who lowered his own old mark of 44.98 seconds to 44.33 seconds;
- Matthew Brown in his Audi RS4 in Type AWD/SV3 over 3000cc, who cut the old record of 43.64 seconds to 43.62 seconds; and
- **lain Chandler** in his GR Yaris who established the record for Type AWD/SV4 2001-3000cc of 45.84 seconds.

We hope to open entries very soon so keep a close on eye on your e-mails and on the club's Facebook page.



EASING OF COVID RESTRICTIONS

The ACT Government eased COVID restrictions so it is no longer mandatory for people coming to hillclimbs (drivers, pit crews, officials or spectators) to check in electronically using the *Check In CBR* app and QR code.

However the government wishes organisations to continue to display the *Check in CBR* QR code for voluntary use by members of the community. So the posters with the SDMA QR symbol remain around the track.

SDMA encourages everyone to follow general community COVID precautions such as observing social distancing, using hand sanitiser when appropriate and wearing masks if they wish. These general precautions are set out in the revised SDMA COVID-19 Conditions of Entry, which are displayed at both entrances to the track (competitors and spectators) and around the central Pit Stop Café area.

SDMA SCRUTINEERING ARRANGEMENTS

- 1. Before COVID-19, SDMA practice was that every car was scrutineered before every event.
- 2. Motorsport Australia's 'Return To Race' COVID management policies stopped physical scrutineering of vehicles at events. Instead competitors are required to complete an on-line self-scrutiny declaration when submitting an event entry.
 - Because of concerns about the time between a competitor completing the on-line self-scrutiny
 form at time of entry and their vehicle lining up at an event, SDMA developed the SDMA
 Statement of Vehicle Compliance, which competitors must hand in on arrival at the track on the
 day of the event. It requires the competitor to confirm that they have examined their vehicle in
 the 72 hours before the event and certify that it still meets the standards set out in the on-line
 self-scrutiny declaration.
- 3. COVID restrictions have eased but SDMA has not returned to an 'every car, every event' approach. Instead, SDMA has adopted the following scrutineering policy:

On-Line Entry

- (1). Only on-line entries are accepted. This is no change from pre-COVID.
- (2). Competitors are required to complete the **Motorsport Australia on-line self-scrutiny declaration** when submitting an entry.
- (3). Competitors are required to complete the **SDMA Statement of Vehicle Compliance** and hand it in when arriving at the track on the day of the event.

Before the Event starts

- (1). Any **vehicle** entered for the first time will be scrutineered in the Scrutineering Bay before the event starts. This applies even if the driver has competed previously.
- (2). Any **driver** competing for the first time must take their vehicle to the Scrutineering Bay to be scrutineered before the event starts. This applies even if the vehicle has competed at the hillclimb before.
 - Before an event, the Event Secretary and Chief Scrutineer will identify the vehicles to be scrutineered under (1) and (2).
- (3). In addition to vehicles checked under (1) and (2) above, 10 per cent of total entries will be scrutineered before the event starts. The aim is that every regularly entered car will be physically scrutineered at least once a year.

Before an event, the Chief Scrutineer will decide the vehicles to scrutineered under (3).

Drivers whose vehicles are to be scrutineered will be told on arrival at the track.

At scrutineering, drivers will be responsible for opening doors, bonnets, boots etc.

PPE (principally, but not only, disposable gloves and masks) will be provided for scrutineers.

During the Event

- (1). Any vehicle which activates the noise meter must be physically scrutineered before being allowed to compete again.
- (2). The Clerk of Course or the Chief Scrutineer (or the Chief Scrutineer's delegate) can require any vehicle to be physically scrutineered.
- (3). Random checks of driver apparel (principally helmets) can be done at any time.



REMINDERS FOR ALL HILLCLIMB ENTRANTS

- You must be a *current* financial member of SDMA to compete. If your membership has expired please contact the Membership Secretary, Ross Samuelson, at sdmamembership20@gmail.com. For 2022, membership is \$55 for individuals and \$75 for families.
- You must have a current Motorsport Australia (MA) Speed licence to compete.
- You must have, and use, a Motorsport Australia approved safety helmet (see the "Competitors' Information" section of the club website https://www.sdmahillclimb.com.au/competitors for details of approved types).
- Your vehicle must be roadworthy and safe to compete and meet the safety requirements set out in the "Competitors' Information" section of the club website https://www.sdmahillclimb.com.au/competitors.
- Drivers must wear long trousers (no shorts) and long sleeved shirts made from a natural fibre such as cotton (no tee shirts), and enclosed footwear. Any clothing, including footwear, made of flammable synthetic material, such as nylon for example, is not acceptable.



- If your car has a Motorsport Australia logbook you must have, and must use, a Motorsport Australia compliant frontal head restraint (FHR), previously known as a HANS device.
 - There is no requirement to have or use a FHR if you are driving a road registered car or an unregistered vehicle which does not have a Motorsport Australia logbook.
- You will need to provide your own COVID personal protective equipment such as hand sanitiser, disposable gloves and face masks (if you want to wear one). There are hand sanitising stations around the track..
